## A SPIRITUAL PERSPECTIVE ~ The Rev. Dr. Todd Shipley, Pastor



*The art or the music in which we thought the beauty was located will betray us if we trust them; it was not in them, it only came through them, and what came through them was longing. These things—the beauty, the*

*memory of our own past—are good images of what we really desire; but if they are mistaken for the thing itself they turn into dumb idols, breaking the hearts of their worshipers. For they are not the thing itself; they are only the scent of a flower we have not found, the echo of a tune we have not heard, news from a country we have never yet visited. - C. S. Lewis*

I remember the first time I saw the fresco above. This is ‘The Last Judgment’ by Michelangelo which is on the altar wall of the Sistine Chapel. I had the great privilege of being alone with it thanks to a generous gift from Lisa. It was truly awesome to the point of overwhelming. When I say it was on the wall, I mean it was painted on to the entire wall. The human bodies you see are literally larger than life. You see Jesus in the center as he returns to earth, and some people are being blessed while people on the bottom of the fresco are being judged unworthy of the kingdom. There are many things happening and I reflected on what these depictions mean to my own faith. How would I be judged at the ‘End of Days’ or maybe just the end of my days? I continued my tour of the Vatican Museum which culminated with breakfast as the crowd of tourists grew all around us.

Lisa and I decided to go back through the Sistine chapel on the way out. This time my experience was much different. The chapel was filled with people and the air was filled with security guards shouting: ‘no photos!’ and ‘move along!’ As I watched the tourists hurry past all the magnificent images with barely a glance, I had a fleeting feeling of resentment. I’m sure many people there were followers of Christ, but there were plenty who were not and the whole situation took on a very kitschy and touristy feel. But as I walked out of the chapel my resentment quickly turned to a kind of sadness. Most of the visitors were enjoying the surface of the artworks but I doubted they saw ‘through’ them. To understand what I mean read, or re-read, the C.S. Lewis quote above. I realize that my thoughts about the tourists may come across as judgmental, but I ascribe to the notion that judgment is God’s job and not mine. No, my concern for their spiritual well-being is captured by the words of Lewis.

What art can do if we let it, especially religious art, is tell us what ‘could be.’ Lewis, of course, says it better than I ever could. In preparing to write this article I read a piece by Dustin Messer titled ‘How Art Can Prepare You for Suffering’ that may help us understand what it means to ‘see through’ art. It was an excellent bit of writing and I would like to share one take away that might help our souls this summer, amidst the crises in our country and around the world. Here is the quote that stuck with me:

*“We’ll only be able to make sense of the world’s ugliness in a moment of crisis if we first try to make sense of the world’s beauty in moments of transcendent joy.” - Dustin Messer*

Now making sense of beauty sounds good, but first we must ‘make sense’ of what he means by the phrase. We can make sense of beauty by remembering that the Christian account of the world holds that creation is sacramental. It points beyond itself to the Creator, and also points to a powerful attribute of God as a creator of Beauty. An oversimplification might be:

*An essential component of God’s creation is balance, the ugliness in the world is balanced by beauty and goodness but we must choose it and seek it out.*

Cooper is always a little downhearted when he receives his ‘summer packet’ from school. It seems seriously unjust to him, and maybe it is, that he is made to do schoolwork during the summer. I apologize but: Here is your ‘Summer Packet.’ FIND beauty, truth, and goodness and, if you have to, create it. Now listen, this isn’t going to be easy. It will not be enough, especially these days, to go about the world and see beauty in a glance. This Summer I challenge you to seek the beauty found deep in God’s creation, up to and including his favorite creation: Us.

Here is some practice. Go get your Bible and read Matthew 6:25-34.

## ***HEALTH CORNER ~ The New Normal and Coronavirus***

The COVID-19 pandemic has changed life as we know it. As the rate of infections begins to slow down in some hard-hit areas, early signs of recovery are appearing. Some towns, cities and states are starting to slowly reopen businesses, public areas and more. What will “the new normal” mean for you? Lisa Maragakis, senior director of infection prevention at Johns Hopkins, discusses things to consider, possible next steps and how you can continue to keep yourself healthy.

### **How can I protect myself from COVID-19 as cities and states start to reopen?**

Until a safe, effective coronavirus vaccine is available, there will continue to be a risk of infection, even as people get back to work, school and a more normal life. The protective practices you learned and followed in March and April of 2020 can continue to protect you and your family:

- **Social and physical distancing.** Staying at least 6 feet away from anyone not living in your household can help you prevent infection.
- **Handwashing.** Washing your hands for at least 20 seconds frequently throughout the day, or using hand sanitizer, is an effective way to avoid getting sick with the coronavirus or other germs.
- Wearing a **face mask** protects others from illness if you’re carrying the virus and don’t know it.
- Practice **safe grocery shopping and food handling.**
- Continue to **practice mindfulness and stress relief**, as you did during stay-at-home orders. Mental and emotional well-being is a key aspect of health.

### **Staying informed about coronavirus can also help you:**

- Know what to do if **you think you have the coronavirus**: whom to call, where to go.
- Understand what to expect **if you’re diagnosed with COVID-19.**

- Look out for signs of the **coronavirus in babies and kids**. Although the majority of children who contract COVID-19 have mild symptoms, a small percentage of patients under age 18 have experienced severe disease, including a **rare inflammatory condition**.
- Understand **who's more at risk**. Older people and those living with heart disease, diabetes and other chronic illnesses have a greater chance of dying from COVID-19.

**If you are wondering when will the coronavirus end, you're not alone.** As communities start to reopen, we will likely see future outbreaks and clusters of viral transmission, which could cause the number of COVID-19 cases to increase again. That's because COVID-19 is contagious: Each person who catches it infects, on average, about two other people, and some infect many more. Many people infected with the virus do not have symptoms and can unknowingly infect another person who could become very sick. That means that, until a vaccine is widely available, even if your location is "open for business," you still need to take precautions so that employees and customers don't catch or spread COVID-19. For your safety and the safety of others, continue to follow all safety guidelines described above.
