

A SPIRITUAL PERSPECTIVE

This is called a Christian 'Mandala.' Mandala is a Sanskrit word that simply means circle. Contemplative people for many centuries have used these images to calm and center their minds during prayer. Let's make some mandalas this Fall. First choose a word that represents a spiritual gift you would like to develop in your life and put that in the center, then begin to color it in a way that represents to you that gift. A simple example might be to put the word love in the center and color it varying shades of red. Spend your prayer time coloring this then simply gazing into it when you are done.

Then make an appointment to share your mandala with me if you are comfortable with that.

I will be featuring some of your mandalas this Advent season.

"Have faith in God. Truly I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be taken up and cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says is going to happen, it will be granted him. Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you your transgressions. "But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father who is in heaven forgive your transgressions."


UNITY HILL CHURCH PICNIC

BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE




Learn to write your hurts in the sand and to carve your benefits in stone. Have a great day!! S

REGISTRATION SUNDAY IS SEPTEMBER 14TH!

Christian Ed will be collecting forms (to be mailed out soon), have fun games for the kids, and informing adults about teaching opportunities.



Dear Parents/Guardians,

We are so excited for the 2014-15 Christian Ed year! Attached is a Sunday School Registration Form. Please fill it out and return to church on *Registration Sunday*, September 14th. If you're not available to attend, please return it to the Christian Education mailbox, or mail back to the Church Office at 364 White Plains Road, Trumbull CT 06611. Alternatively, you can save yourself a stamp and complete this form on our website at www.unityhillucc.org!

For those $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ grade, we are introducing a new Sunday School curriculum called **Grapple**. This curriculum lets the teachers use attention-grabbing lessons with thought-

provoking videos, fun games, and deep life-changing Bible lessons that will engage students' attention. This new curriculum is teacher friendly and we hope you will consider joining our teacher rotation schedule. More information will be available at *Registration Sunday*.

In order to accommodate our current membership and teachers, our classes are now divided as follows: Newborn through Kindergarten (*Followers*) will gather in the Nursery for storytime, video lessons, and/or songs. 1st through 5th graders (*Shepherds*) and middle schoolers (*Disciples*) will gather downstairs to 'Grapple' questions about their faith. Please note that to accommodate for the new curriculum, **children will be reporting straight to their Sunday School classroom at the beginning of service**. Shepherds and Disciples will be returning to the sanctuary every first Sunday of the month for Communion (children will be sitting with their parents, so partaking in communion will be at the parent's discretion).

Also new this year, we will be collecting offerings at Sunday School. We will encourage students to earn money (via chores) and give a share to the church. Money collected will be used to purchase animals through Heifer International. Be on the lookout for more information on this program to learn how the children (and the church) will be involved!

Anyone above 8th grade is being asked to stay in the sanctuary during service. Teachers need to focus on their students and having anyone other than those under their care can be a distraction. Should anyone 8th grade and below have permission from their parent to not participate in Sunday School, we ask that they stay in the sanctuary with their parent or guardian.

This year, we will be offering a Confirmation Class to those in 7th and 8th grade. Classes will begin in the Spring, and information will be available to those qualified to participate.

As many of you know, Unity Hill offers scholarship money for attendance at Silver Lake Conference Center. The amount of the scholarship will be determined by the applicant's Sunday School attendance, Youth Group attendance and participation, involvement in fundraising events, and community service completed with, and through, the church youth groups. More information will be available in January 2015.

As always, CE is grateful for the volunteers who make it all possible! We are here to make your child's church experience meaningful and memorable, and appreciate all the help we receive. Remember, it takes a village....

HEALTH CORNER

What is your Blood Pressure? It is the pressure of the heat muscle when it is contracting and relaxing. There are two numbers to consider. The higher number is called the Systolic pressure and the lower number is called the Diastolic pressure. The systolic pressure should ideally be 120 or less and the diastolic should be 80 or less. A perfect number might be 120/80. Numbers that are lower are seldom a concern in a healthy person. Hypertension is the name for the disease called High Blood Pressure.

Prehypertension exists when the systolic pressure is between 120 and 140 and/or the diastolic is above 90. This is usually treated with lifestyle changes such as limiting sodium or salt intake, losing weight and reducing alcohol intake.

Hypertension or high blood pressure is present when the systolic pressure is over 140 and/or the diastolic pressure is over 90. It is usually treated with medications. Several kinds of medications are available. A physician needs to write a prescription for these medications.
